I can hardly express how much I feel refreshed by having seen you and Dr. Hoines, although only for so short a time. Indeed, many things have since entered my mind, on which I wished to talk with you, but which we must now reserve for a more favourable opportunity.

which I mentioned, from Glenmalur in
Wicklow: I shall be glad to know what
it is considered to be, as it is the only thing
of the kind which I found in the Granite
of that district. If I had only been

at home when you were in London, I
could have shown you several matters of
interest in the mineralogical way.

When you write to me from Wien, make
use of English or German, as you like; -
the employment of the former will be good
practice for you, whilst the latter - if
it is easier to you will be equally

welcome to me: we must at all events
make the agreement, that you never send
me a letter in the Slavackish or any other
branch of the grand Pan-slavic language,
& in return I will promise not to terrify
you with Welsh or Irish.

companion, and with many greetings for
all good friends at Vienna, and wishes
for your pleasant journey there, and
speedy return again here, believe me
